Some of the most photographed steel-rod sculptures reside along the name of Muntri Street.

The area around Armenian Street, the most visited tourist street in Penang, is also a great place to view and photograph street art. One of the most popular here is a steel-rod sculpture which depicts the wealthy and influential Chinese community leader Chung Keng Kwee, or

Another piece tells us how the paper oblation business on Lebuh Carnarvon thrived on the Chinese belief that all pleasures of the material world, even bungalows and cars, could be sent to the hereafter by reproducing them in paper and burning them.


