

TELUK BAHANG

Beauty. Serenity. Harmony. These words describe Teluk Bahang very well. Its name means 'bay of heat wave' which refers to the hot sea breeze that blows onto the coast. This small, idyllic fishing village is situated at the northwestern tip of Penang Island. Ironically, it is considered as part of the Southwest Penang Island District, which extends to include the majority of the island. Its soothing and welcoming atmosphere complements the beautiful natural landscapes that can be seen throughout the village.

Teluk Bahang was originally founded as an agricultural village where the majority of the population were fishermen. Over the years, it has gradually developed into a tourist destination dotted with a wide variety of attractions such as beaches, parks, gardens, theme parks, museums and farms. Serving as the perfect backdrop for photos, the captivating views add to its rustic charm.



TROPICAL ENCLAVE



An olfactory heaven awaits in the form of **Tropical Spice Garden**. It is Southeast Asia's one and only award-winning tropical garden spanning over 8 acres of secondary jungle, filled with more than 500 tropical species of flora and fauna. Tropical Spice Garden was once an abandoned rubber plantation until its founders turned it into a tropical paradise with a soothing, zen-like environment. However, if you are not one to enjoy simply walking around the gardens, there are plenty of other activities to take part in.



Pitcher Plant Roundabout
Also known as the Teluk Bahang Monkey Cup Roundabout, it is one of Teluk Bahang's landmarks that stands out with vibrant colours and prominent sculptures.

Food lovers, rejoice! There are plenty of gastronomic offerings that will definitely tantalise your palate and satisfy your cravings such as beef rendang, satay, crispy duck and spring rolls. At Teluk Bahang Market, you can find fresh meats, fish, fruits and vegetables, along with must-try local dishes.

Around with mesmerising panoramas of landscape and seascape that will delight your senses, there is something for everyone at Teluk Bahang. Many fun hours of exploration and discoveries await in the form of electrifying and action-packed adventures as well as diverse species of flora and fauna throughout parks, gardens and farms. The fine balance of excitement and tranquility of Teluk Bahang makes for an enticing and memorable experience.

The Garden Tour (either guided or audio) is an exploration of tropical rainforest as well as the lavish foliage and exotic species of flowers growing in abundance in the gardens. The gardens are also filled with all manner of spices and herbs from around the world and a full tour of the gardens usually takes up to 2-3 hours. You can also learn how to cook Malay, Nyonya and Indian dishes through the hands-on cooking classes. Or you can just sit back, relax and enjoy the exotic Thai delights served at the Tree Monkey Restaurant.



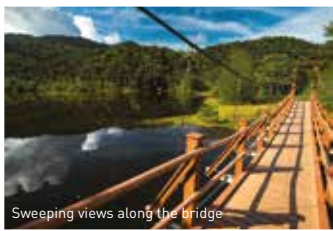
Beauty Of The Night
If you are feeling especially adventurous, there are even Night Walks available every 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month (advance booking required) where you can learn more about the Garden's nocturnal side. Children will be kept busy learning about nature through various Nature Education Programs.

NATURE, ADVENTURE AND WONDER

Filled with many flourishing species of flora and fauna, the **Penang National Park** is a treasure trove of natural wonders comprising coastal hill dipterocarps, mangroves, beaches, and rocky shores. There are plenty of avenues to observe and photograph birds and forest animals in their natural habitat. With such a wide range of activities available, there is no reason to get bored in here.



- Things to Bring**
- Lots of drinking water, and maybe some snacks
 - Good shoes with decent grip (some trails may be slippery, especially if it rained recently!)
 - Mosquito repellent and wet weather gear (to stay dry and protect your valuables in case it rains!)



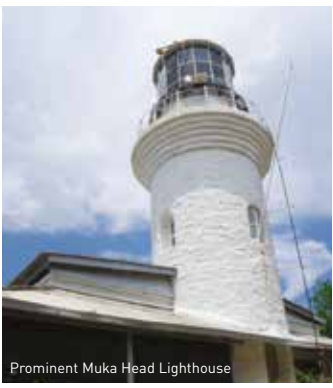
Visitors to the National Park are required to register at the park's main entrance. A map of the park can also be obtained here.

ROUTE 1
Penang National Park Entrance → Monkey Beach → Muka Head Lighthouse

There are a few hiking trails beginning at the park entrance, each leading to different havens and wonders. The first trail is fairly easy and bears west for roughly 1.5 hours of easy walking before reaching the first stop. **Monkey Beach** derived its name from the macaque monkeys living within the vicinity. Accessible by boat or a hike, this scenic beach has shacks selling drinks and snacks as well as vendors offering water sports and quad bike excursions.



From there, you can choose to hike on for another 40 minutes to go to the **Muka Head Lighthouse**. Known as one of the three landmark lighthouses in Penang, it was built during the 1880s by the British administration as a guide to approaching boats. A stairway is open to the public from 9am to 3pm, spiraling all the way to the top of this prominent white granite tower from which a mesmerizing vista of the blue-green sea at Batu Ferringhi and Teluk Ketapang can be enjoyed.



ROUTE 2
Penang National Park Entrance → Coastal Trail → Pantai Kerachut → Teluk Kampi

If you prefer a quieter environment to explore the wonders of nature, follow the other hiking trail south towards **Pantai Kerachut** (aka Turtle Beach) and take the first left up over the hill and down again the other side. This pathway is quite wide, easy to follow and not too steep.

ROUTE 3
Penang National Park Entrance → Meromictic Lake → Pantai Kerachut → Teluk Kampi

Avid hikers are recommended to take the longer route to **Pantai Kerachut** which has a rare wonder along the way.

A truly fantastic wonder of the world awaits - a seasonal **meromictic lake**. A meromictic lake is one where the salty sea water and fresh water remain separated due to their different densities - a very rare occurrence indeed.

Natural Meromictic Lake
Did you know there are fewer than 20 natural meromictic lakes in the whole world? Another natural meromictic lake is the famous Dead Sea. However, the Dead Sea is a permanent lake while ours is seasonal, happening during the change of monsoon (typically April-May and October-November).

ARTISTIC AND FRUITFUL PURSUITS



Tropical Fruit Farm is an organic orchard measuring 25 acres with over 250 types of nutrient-rich tropical and subtropical fruits. There are 30-minute guided farm tours (available in English or Mandarin) conducted periodically from 9am to 5pm daily. After the tour, you will get the chance to relax and enjoy the breathtaking view while sampling a wide variety of freshly cut fruits and fruit juices. There will also be lunch and dinner buffets with a free flow of fruits available with prior booking.

As part of the farm's effort to promote better living, there are classes such as "How to make your very own coconut oil" and "How to make your very own enzyme" available at the farm. There is also a shop where you can sample fruit enzymes, honey and tea. Don't miss out on this fun and educational tour.

Fruits from Around the World
It has an impressive collection of rare and exotic fruit trees from the region, Central and South America, Central Africa, India, the Middle East, the Caribbean, the Pacific Islands and more.



If you're an art enthusiast, be sure to check out **Art & Garden**. This beautiful venue is filled with a large collection of plants, sculptures and installations. Creative works such as outdoor murals, ceramics, mosaics and a koi fish pond by local and international artists are dotted throughout this sanctuary which offers extensive views of Penang Hill.



Once you have arrived at Pantai Kerachut, you will find an environment of peace and quiet perfect for a day of relaxation after the hike. There is also a turtle conservatory nearby where you can learn more about this endangered species and how to help them.

The **Penang Turtle Sanctuary** helps preserve and protect turtles by hatching turtle eggs and raising the hatchlings in small ponds until they are old enough to stand a good chance of survival in the wild before releasing them, thus increasing the chances of the babies making it to adulthood and coming back to their birthplace to lay their own eggs in the future.

From there, you can continue onwards to **Teluk Kampi**, but be forewarned! This trail is not for the faint-hearted. It is very steep, narrow and not a very well-marked pathway. However, Teluk Kampi is a treat as it is even more secluded and peaceful and boasts the longest stretch of beach in the National Park.

Camp Under the Stars
Nature enthusiasts also have the option of camping within the park free of charge. There are two campsites within the park - one near Pantai Kerachut, one near Teluk Kampi. The campsites are equipped with basic toilet facilities, tables, and benches but no electricity. There is also a kitchen area where you can set up a portable stove or start a campfire.

ESCAPE TO PARADISE



Looking for exciting adventures and adrenaline-pumping thrills? Experience it all at **ESCAPE** where lots of exciting attractions await! Don't miss the chance to ride the world's longest water slide, measuring an impressive 1,111m! Winding through enchanting jungle treetops, this Guinness World Record water slide is packed with twists and turns for a mind-blowing four-minute ride.



Waterpark Wonders
Get ready for lots of splash-splashing fun at ESCAPE Waterplay! Beat the heat as you ride the water slides and twistlers! There are also downhill sleds, zip coasters and swimming pools for your enjoyment.

FESTIVITIES OF CULTURE



Known as the largest dam in Penang, the **Teluk Bahang Dam** was built to serve as an alternative water supply. From its crest, one can enjoy a scenic view of the northern coast of the island. The dam has a height and length of 58.5m and 685m respectively, and a crest 12 metres thick, allowing for a roadway to be built along it.

Every year, the **Penang International Dragon Boat Festival** is held at the Teluk Bahang Dam in honour of the spirit of the dragon and the spirit of unity as the participants work together as a team for one common purpose. Spectators will get a thrill out of watching the boats adorned with colourful dragon heads and tails race each other to the finish line - truly an event of power, speed and endurance. Vibrant Dragon Boats
Did you know that the dragon emblem represents unity? This is because the dragon is said to be a combination of other Chinese zodiac animals. The brightly coloured dragon boats usually have intricate designs in the form of a dragon head and tail.



The **Floating Chariot Procession** (Masi Magam Theppa Thiruvizha) is a Hindu festival that attracts tens of thousands of devotees to Sri Singamuga Kaliyamman Temple between mid-February and mid-March. The ceremony is held to thank the Goddess, Sri Singamuga Kaliyamman for her good grace and to ask her for protection and prosperity. During this elaborate procession, the Goddess will be carried on a floating chariot adorned with lights and flowers along the seaside of Teluk Bahang.

FOOD GALORE

As part of the nation's food capital, Teluk Bahang is hailed by many as a place filled with fresh and mouthwatering seafood (after all, it is a fishing village). One of the restaurants that has received many positive reviews is **Tai Tong Seafood**. This type of restaurant often presents basins from which guests are invited to handpick their own live seafood to be prepared on the spot. Food doesn't get any fresher than that!



Hankering for authentic local favourites apart from seafood? Among the go-to spots is **Belimbing Cafe Corner**, widely known for its generously sized roti jala. Savour it with your preferred curry, along with dishes such as roti canai and roti planta.



If you traverse beyond Teluk Bahang, drop by the adjacent Batu Ferringhi for numerous culinary options: Western fare and seafood at **Ferringhi Garden**, Middle Eastern cuisine at **Grand Lebanon**, Malaysian-style menu items at **Andrew's Kampung**, local and Western food, booze and non-alcoholic drinks at **Bora Bora by Sunset** and more.

SCENIC BALIK PULAU

Did you know that Teluk Bahang is approximately 20km (35 minutes by car) away from Balik Pulau? Balik Pulau is a tranquil township filled with countryside charm and greenery along with natural attractions, wonderful food and brilliant works of art. 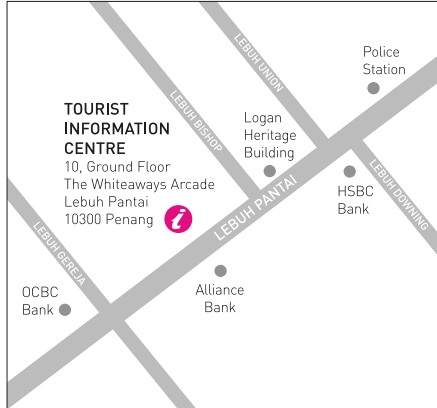
