

KING OF THE HILL

Despite being a Southeast Asian favourite for centuries, the durian remains as one of the most beguiling and intriguing fruits due to its interesting taste and smell. Durian, the 'King of Fruits', is known for its size and thorns. The word 'durian' comes from the Malay word 'duri', which means 'thorn'.

It is the "King of Fruits" for many reasons, one being the obvious ring of spikes encircling its stem, mimicking a crown. Another reason is that the king of the jungle, the tiger is said to be a durian lover. Though rare, Sumatran durian farmers still see tigers wandering into durian orchards during the harvest season.

10 FUN FACTS ABOUT DURIAN

PROBABLY HAVEN'T HEARD OF THESE

- The fruit contains monosaturated fats which help fight bad levels of cholesterol.
- In Malaysia, the durian flesh is often used in traditional soups, sauces and curries.
- It raises the levels of serotonin in the brain, creating a feeling of euphoria.
- In West Malaysia, Penang is one of the oldest provinces to develop durian plantations, beginning as early as the 1950s.
- Penang has the perfect sweltering weather for durians to come to fruition.
- In Malaysia, durian season is between May to September while in Penang, peak durian season is from June to July.
- On average, durians weigh about as much as a new born baby (1-3kg/2-7lb).
- There are more than 100,000 hectares of durian orchards in Malaysia.
- Durians are banned in most hotels, public transportation and on planes.
- Durian trees can grow up to 50 metres in height, which is half of the size of Big Ben in London!

AUTHENTIC DURIAN DISHES TO SAVOUR

- LEMPOK DURIAN**
Local toffee made from glutinous rice flour, coconut milk and palm sugar.
- TEMPOYAK**
Fermented durian, commonly added in curries or stir-fried dishes.
- PULUT DURIAN / DURIAN STICKY RICE**
This sticky dessert is a mixture of glutinous rice drenched in coconut milk.
- DURIAN PENGAT**
A dessert made from sweet potatoes mixed with palm sugar, coconut milk and durian flesh.
- WAJIK**
A diamond-shaped snack made using glutinous rice and durian flesh, then flavoured with palm sugar, coconut milk and pandan leaves.
- DURIAN FLOWERS IN SAMBAL BELACAN**
The bleached stamens and yellow petals of the durian flower are added into sambal belacan for a flavourful aroma.
- DURIAN CHICKEN SOUP**
2-3 durians slow-cooked in a pot with chicken and slices of ginger.
- DURIAN CHIPS**
Thinly sliced unripe durian deep fried in vegetable oil.
- CHARGRILLED DURIAN**
Barbecuing the entire fruit until blackened then opening it to find crispy yet creamy flesh.

UNCONVENTIONAL DURIAN DELICACIES

- DURIAN MOONCAKE**
A rich thick filling of durian paste surrounded by a thin mooncake crust.
- DURIAN CAKE**
A super fluffy and moist cake or a cheesecake base with a creamy durian filling.
- DURIAN PUFF**
Similar to a custard puff, but filled with durian cream instead.
- DURIAN CENDOL**
A shaved ice dessert served with coconut milk, palm sugar, durian flesh, green rice flour jelly and red kidney beans.
- DURIAN ICE CREAM**
Frozen durian flesh, milk and non-dairy whipping cream.
- DURIAN SHAVED ICE**
Durian flavoured shaved ice topped with nuts, syrup, panna cotta or ice cream.

CHOOSING THE RIGHT DURIAN

Do You Know How to Pick a Durian?



Hold the durian carefully, with gloves if needed.



Look for any signs of holes, no holes means there are no bugs burrowing inside.



Wiggle the stem, if it feels loose, then it's almost ripe, if it breaks off easily, it's ripe and ready!



You should get a faint sweet smell. A strong aroma means it's overripe and if there's no smell, it's unripe. Be careful not to prick your nose when smelling it!



DURIAN'S CULTURAL INFLUENCES

Whether you believe it or not, here are the top 8 myths - and facts - about the King of Fruits.

1 Back in the day, durian sellers would open as many durians as needed until customers were fully satisfied in order to seal the deal.

2 According to Chinese beliefs, durians are "heaty". You can balance your Chi by eating mangosteens, which are cooling or drink water out of an empty durian shell.

3 Did you know? The fruit has killed people in the past and still does every year! So, mind your head when venturing into a durian orchard on your own.

4 According to traditional Malay medicine, durian leaves and its roots can be used to bring down a fever.

5 Locals believe that if a durian falls and lands on any part of your body, it means you're a wicked person or just really unlucky.

6 Be mindful of what you say when you're roaming durian farms, folklore has it that because the fruit has eyes it can see where it's falling.

7 Eating durians during a pregnancy may cause your infant to develop acne.

8 A popular urban myth is to wash your hands under running water with a durian husk to remove any lingering odour.
